On this Fourth Sunday of Advent, the humble carpenter, Joseph, is given to us as an example. Joseph could not have imagined how he would one day fit into God's eternal plan of salvation, but he was ready to respond when called by the Lord. We may also often wonder how the Lord is working through each and every one of us in order to fulfil His Will. Like Joseph, we too are asked to be open to the Lord's will and ready to respond in faith and with generosity when the Lord calls us into His service.

As the angels communicated God's message, "do not be afraid", both to Mary and Joseph, that same message is communicated to us today. Do not be afraid to do the will of God and to welcome the Lord Jesus into your heart and home. In these days before Christmas, take the opportunity to consider how your heart still needs to be prepared for the Lord's coming. Maybe there is sin weighing on your heart and a good confession would bring about much needed healing and the opportunity to receive the Eucharist this Christmas in a state of grace. Maybe you have been holding a grudge against someone and letting go would bring about long-sought peace and tranquillity. Maybe the Lord has been knocking at the door of your heart asking you to draw closer to Him in prayer, but you have been hesitant about responding to Him out of fear. "Do not be afraid", "let the Lord enter; he is the king of glory" (Ps 24).

Loving God, like Joseph, we too are often afraid to take Jesus into our hearts lest he ask too much of us. Help us to be like Mary, open and obedient, generous and hospitable. Mary knew how difficult life could be. Through her intercession may we have no fear in saying yes to what you ask of us.


